### **CALL TO CONFESSION**

P: The mob action that sent Jesus to the cross was fed by fears and anger we are reluctant to claim. Yet we, too, reject the Holy One at times, by our neglect if not by deliberate intent. Let us acknowledge Scripture's call for us to repent and turn back to the Lord, that our sins may we wiped away. Let us first read the prayer to ourselves silently if we have not already, then we'll pray it together aloud.

### PRAYER OF CONFESSION

A: God, we confess that we do not have You all figured out, but we act as if we do. We do not wait with patience for Your words of wisdom and direction. We raise Your banner high but do our own will. Have mercy on us who love You but have not been able to separate our desire for power, our desire to make the rules, our desire to speak for You, from Your calling on our lives. Help us, O God, remember that we are mere sinners, seeking Your grace, for which we ask in the name of Your Son our Risen Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

### **ASSURANCE OF PARDON 1 John 2:1-2**

P: "My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world."

There we hear it and have it! Jesus took our sins upon himself in incomprehensible agape love, and through him they are forgiven, washed away, and no longer in the memory of our God. Luke 24:36b-48

Luke 24: 41-43 Yet for all their joy they were still disbelieving and wondering, and he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Dear Brother Jesus, Dear Christ now Risen -

We are always asking you for things, it seems.

Someone wants healing from illness.

Someone needs freedom from addiction.

The nations cry for peace.

The groaning planet sighs for relief.

For these we pray in our requests,

We pray also that we will recognize

You when you give us these things - healing, freedom, peace, relief.

But hey there Jesus, hey there Christ now Risen, Here is how we will actually-factually recognize you. One day, You will come to us. We'll be sitting together, (probably wondering aloud where you've gotten to now) and there you'll be.

You'll say, "Do you have anything to eat here, siblings?"

That day, you might be in one of your disconcerting disguises, brother Jesus.

You might not smell good or speak our language.

You might not look like us or think like us.

But this is how you let us know
That we can recognize you.
Because you will ask us, like this,
"Don't you have anything to eat here?"
And all we will be able to say is yes, yes, yes.
And then, Oh! It's you!

### 1 John 3:1 - 7

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

### Luke 24:36 - 48

While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets,

and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."
