CALL TO CONFESSION

P: We lift up our hearts, but they are not without heaviness, for we understand that along with our zeal for God and desire for worship, they also bear our sins of character, word and deed. To lift up our hearts is praise; it is also a sign of readiness to confess, and upon forgiveness, lift them ever higher.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

P:

- Merciful God, on this upcoming day of rest, won for us by laborers, we confess we neglect Your command to rest on the sabbath. We may even take pride in how hard and how long we work, which goes against what is right for our physical and mental health, strikes against the shalom You wish for us.
- RIGHT SIDE: Grant us perspective on the balance between labor and rest, so we may better serve You and others.
- LEFT SIDE: We confess we have fallen short when it comes to worrying about fair treatment of workers; we are more likely to get anxious if a strike is called because of how it will negatively affect us, and not how it will hurt the workers or the company. We get self-focused again, which is rarely if ever where You want us to be.

P:

Speak to us, great God, so we will hear and follow Your words to take rest from our labors, and not play the hero. Speak to us, God, so gatherings of Your people who find themselves on various sides of labor disputes will have open minds toward the parties and issues. Give us eyes to perceive that which is just, and that which is not. All unity is a glory to the One who came that we may all be one, even Jesus Christ, in whose name we pray. Amen.


ASSURANCE OF PARDON First Corinthians 15:3,4

P: Paul wrote, "For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures."



We do ask our St. Peter's young ones to complete a Communicants Class first (6th grade). The servers will bring the elements to you in the pews. Please hold your bread until all are served; we will partake together at the Pastor's prompting as a sign of Christian unity, likewise with the cup. The innermost circle of cups in the wine tray holds grape juice and the outer circle is wine. Please note: we now offer Gluten-free wafers in a separate cup. Please dispose of the plastic single-serve communion cups and lids as they leave the sanctuary. The Elders are no longer counting the empty cups after the service, and trash receptacles are provided by both exit doors. Thank you!

September 3, 2023 Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost Romans 12:9-21 Spirit-Led Living

A Labor Day litany in the wake of pandemic, based on Romans 12:9-21

Holy God,

On this Labor Day, we give you thanks. We thank You, for those whose work brings them to the front lines of caring and curing. We thank you for doctors and hospital janitors, nurses and nursing assistants, office workers who keep hospitals running smoothly, scientists who continually quest for vaccines and cures that will keep us safe.

On this Labor Day, we recall Paul's urging in the letter to Romans, to "Love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor." May we do so now.

On this Labor Day, we mourn. We weep with those who have lost loved ones who served on the pandemic's front lines. We recall other areas where safety is compromised and lives are lost, and we vow to continue to make work a place where no one needs fear for their health or safety.

On this Labor Day, we recall Paul's urging in the letter to Romans, to "Love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor." May we do so now.

On this Labor Day, we remember. We remember those who have labored long and given much so that all workers may be safe and fairly compensated. We ask to be reminded that our faith's call to simplicity does not mean that working families should have to sacrifice basic needs like food, housing, and medical care. We pray for the wisdom and the courage needed to create your reign on earth, where all experience plenty, ease, and abundance.

On this Labor Day, we recall Paul's urging in the letter to Romans, to "Love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor." May we do so now.

On this Labor Day, we pray that the love, affection, and honor that Paul impressed upon his friends may also fill our hearts and overflow into all places we live and work. In your holy name we pray, Amen.

Deuteronomy 24:14-15

You shall not withhold the wages of poor and needy laborers, whether other Israelites or aliens who reside in your land in one of your towns. You shall pay them their wages daily before sunset, because they are poor and their livelihood depends on them; otherwise they might cry to the Lord against you, and you would incur guilt.

2nd Timothy 2:14-17a

Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by God, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth. Avoid profane chatter, for it will lead people into more and more impiety, and their talk will spread like gangrene.

Luke 10:38-42

Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."
