Thanks also to everyone involved in acquiring the information about, the supplies for building, their donated purchase, the actual building and painting of, and food donations that have already arrived for, St. Peter's new Mini-Pantry which made its debut yesterday afternoon! The Niles Township Government's Public Relations Outreach Coordinator Mike Isaacs, in coordination with Skokie's Coming Together Project, are our partners / initial resource for this new mission project / community ministry of our church. (Coming Together is a community partnership in Niles Township among organizations in Skokie, Lincolnwood, Morton Grove, and Niles).

Non-perishable food Items will be needed regularly to keep it stocked! Donations can be brought to the office during office hours (M-F 9 – 2) or on Sundays and given to someone with access to the office. The Mini-Pantry is also intended to highlight, raise awareness of, and address food insecurity in our community, which has become more serious due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Mini Pantry will operate on a "Give what you can, take what you need" system, and anyone from anywhere can deposit or withdraw food items. Recommended items include canned goods with ring-pulls; hygiene products: toothpaste/toothbrush, deodorant, soap, menstrual products, peanut butter, kids' snacks; non-perishable foods, bottled water.

Mark 9:30-37

First in Caring Just Peace Sunday

It has been said that in Africa, a traditional greeting and response is, "How are the children?" and "The children are well."

"How are the children?" is not a way to inquire about the particular youth in one's own household, but instead is an invitation to consider what is most important in the whole society, and whether that is being attended to. "The children are well" refers not just to the health of a few of the children who are known to the conversation partners, but the peace and prosperity of all of society. This question, and its response, is a way of assuring that the most important priorities of the community are placed first.

A movie available from the United Church of Christ Palestine Israel Network (UCC PIN) called *How Are the Children*? tells the stories of Palestinian children, some as young as five years old, detained by Israeli forces in the West Bank of Israel. On their website, https://hatcnow.org/, UCC PIN responds to some questions that arise from that first and most important question, "How are the children?"

"Since 1967, the United Church of Christ has spoken through General Synod resolutions regarding issues of peace and justice in the Middle East. Long before that, mission personnel of our predecessor denominations worked successfully to create partnerships of mutuality and ministry throughout the region. Here we provide information on various aspects of UCC witness related to the experience of children in Palestine and Israel. These links provide information regarding the 2017 UCC resolution of witness concerning Palestinian children in Israeli military detention."*

SCRIPTURES FOR THE CONGREGATION Sept. 19, 2021

James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures.

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

Mark 9:30-37

They went on from there and passed through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."
