



About Communion: If you are joining us in person, please take one of the pre-filled Communion / wafer cups offered on tables at the entrance to the sanctuary. If you are joining us at home, the prayer of consecration extends to all who participate wherever you are and whenever you partake of the service (thank You, Holy Spirit!). When prompted, please take whatever bread you have set aside for yourself and anyone with you, take and eat as prompted; when it's time for the cup, please do the same with whatever you have put in your cup at home. This is also how we shall celebrate Holy Communion on Resurrection / Easter Sunday. All who love the Lord and seek to follow Him are invited to share in the sacrament regardless of denominational background.

Our Holy Week services continue tomorrow with a hybrid Good Friday Tenebrae service. We will hear not only the Psalm Jesus quoted on the Cross but also Matthew's version of Jesus' trial, ordeal, crucifixion, and death while we extinguish candles and toll the bell at the end.

Resurrection Sunday worship will be at 10:00 AM this coming Sunday, April 9th! There is no Sunday School; it resumes April 16th (which is also when the Church Council meets next).
