

#### **Totenfest: Tradition and Remembrance**

Across the ages, the church has always found a way to remember and celebrate the lives of faithful people who have died. Totenfest is a distinctive practice that grows out of the Evangelical tradition of the United Church of Christ. At St. Peter's we observe Totenfest on the last Sunday of the liturgical calendar—the Sunday before Advent starts, November 24th this year, to tell the story of the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Totenfest is a German word that means "Festival for the Dead." It started in 1816 when Prussian Emperor Fredrick William III established it to remember that nation's soldiers who had died in the recently concluded Prussian War and church members who had died during the year. In parts of Germany to this day, Totenfest is a time families visit the graves of loved ones to clean off the summer flowers and cover the graves with evergreen boughs for the winter. This year we will light a candle for Ron Schurke and Ken Itter. We will also light candles for others we have lost. Rev. Wayne MacPherson will be our pastor for this special service of remembrance.
