
CLOSING PRAYER AND THE LORD'S PRAYER

To light your candle, tip your unlit candle into the untipped flame offered to you. For those of you joining us virtually, you are invited to light your own candle, and then sing along. When all candles are lit, the lights will begin to fade out. Lights will slowly rise during the Postlude.
