CALL TO WORSHIP from Psalm 149

- P: Praise the Lord! Sing to the Lord a new song, God's praise in the assembly of the faithful!

CALL TO CONFESSION Isaiah 53:6

- P: It's a fitting call to confession given the Scriptures we have today: "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all."
- C: It's true we often go through our days and nights without thinking to ask God for God's desires in our decisions. It's first nature to automatically go with our own will and plans, just assuming God does not have a better idea or a concern.
- P: Going our own way can get us into some pretty serious trouble, and for sure create some distance or estrangement from the Lover of our Souls. Let's draw near to the throne of grace, to ask for God's forgiveness and renewal.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

- P: O God, we have ignored our origin in You and denied Your rule over the nations. We have pursued illusions of self-interest rather than abiding in Your love.
- C: We have turned away from brothers and sisters as if they were enemies to be despised. We are afraid to love those who differ from us or who have the power to harm us.
- P: We hesitate to take the risks of caring, for fear that we may be hurt. Discipleship seems too demanding, Jesus!
- A: O God, release us from our fears and failures to trust Your love and live with bold generosity. Forgive us, we pray, and restore us to Your fold. In the name of Christ Jesus we pray. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON First John 3:16

P: John wrote of Jesus, "We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us – and we ought to lay down our lives for one another."

Jesus laid down His life for us before He was even born; Paul wrote about the Son's self-emptying of himself into a human being, to be for us the perfect Lamb of God who took away the sin of the world. The laying down of His life for us on Calvary actually began with the Incarnation years before. All of it is grounded in God's love for us, God's human flock, to bring us back to God as one flock with one Shepherd. Will the church join me in words of praise for God's grace by saying . . .

April 28, 2024 Fifth Sunday of Easter "Abiding in Love" John 15:1-8

"We are aware that there has been increased violence against indigenous women and transgender persons. Our increased awareness of these issues that disproportionately affect women will impact our response as global advocates." –Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson

On this Break the Silence Sunday, churches can raise their awareness of gender-based violence by participating in Thursdays in Black.

*Thursdays in Black grew out of the World Council of Churches (WCC) Decade of Churches in Solidarity with Women (1988-1998), in which the stories of rape as a weapon of war, gender injustice, abuse, violence, and many tragedies that grow outward from such violence became all the more visible. But what also became visible was women's resilience, agency, and personal efforts to resist such violations. Join Wider Church Ministries, and our partners, in the campaign by doing the following: Pause

Pause for a moment of silence on Thursdays at noon your local time to remember and honor those who have died at the hand of sexualized or gender-based violence.

FIRST JOHN 4:7-21

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

"By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

"God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also."

<u>JOHN 15:1-8</u>

Jesus said, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."
