CALL TO CONFESSION

- P: We sang "so our faces display Your likeness," but we are not that sanctified yet! We are far from such holiness and agape love.
- C: We sang "May our lives tell Your story," and despite our best efforts and successes, we know we still grieve God's Holy Spirit with sins to confess.
- P: Let us, then, so confess them, and know the mercy of God. First let us read it to ourselves, so we know what we are praying, and then we'll pray it together aloud.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Most gracious and loving God, before the font and **A**: waters of baptism we are caught up short. We are reminded of covenants we have made, with You and with others, that we have broken, neglected, or otherwise been unfaithful to. Especially wounding to You, as well as to us, are the times we have freed ourselves of our promises to You. Have we always fulfilled the vows we've made at baptisms? Have we always kept the promises we made when we confirmed our faith, when we joined a church, when we engaged You in prayer? You know the answer is no, and so do we. This we confess and for it we ask Your forgiveness. We ask Your Spirit to move in us and change us, more and more, into Your likeness as the lyrics go. For it is in


the name, and for the sake of, Christ Jesus we pray. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON *First Peter 2: 9,10*

P: "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The congregation is participating in this covenant and sacrament, so please participate aloud as indicated below.

WELCOME

- P: They were bringing children to Jesus that He might touch them; and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, He was indignant and said to them,
- C: 'Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall never enter it.'
- P: And Jesus took them in his arms and blessed them, laying His hands upon them.

ADDRESS

- P: (the address ends with the words . . .) Inasmuch as the promise of the gospel is not only to us but also to our children, baptism with water and the Holy Spirit is the mark of their acceptance into the care of Christ's church, the sign and seal of their participation in God's forgiveness, and the beginning of their growth into full Christian faith and discipleship.

- C: We promise our love, support, and care.



April 30, 2023 Fourth Sunday of Easter Psalm 23 Powerful Witness Pacific Islander and Asian American Ministries Sunday

You are invited to pray deliberately through the 23rd Psalm, perhaps taking one line per day. How is new meaning revealed to you as you make your way slowly through this familiar psalm?

God is my shepherd, I shall not want.

Consider what it would be like to not "want." Pray for all those who are lacking.

God makes me lie down in green pastures,

Touch a piece of earth with your feet, hands, or entire body. How does being in literal touch with creation help you feel closer to the Divine?

Remember times that God has brought you through rough waters. Give thanks.

God restores my soul, and leads me in right paths

Pray by walking. With each step, rejoice in God's renewing presence.

for the sake of God's name.

Pray using all the names of the Divine you can think of. Are there names that make you uncomfortable? Why? Which names are most meaningful to you?

Even though I walk through the darkest valley,

Pray for all those who have no one to pray for them. Ask God to help your prayers become acts of mercy and justice.

I fear no evil; for you are with me;

Remember times when you have felt afraid. What gave you courage?

your rod and your staff--they comfort me.

What are the tools you use in work or hobbies? Notice their shape and ask God to bless them and their use.

You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; As you eat, give special thanks for the land and the hands that produced your meals.

John 10:1-10

Jesus said,

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers."

Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."
