CALL TO WORSHIP

- P: Seek the Lord in this season of reflection and preparation.
- C: We are here to seek the Lord and the Lord's favor.

CALL TO CONFESSION

- P: In our day, we cannot escape temptation, for it comes in so many forms, from so many sources. Often it is not any clear choice to choose something ungodly or wrong, but it is temptation nonetheless. As Jesus was tempted, so are we.
- C: But we have yielded to temptation, and Jesus did not. Sometimes we do not even recognize the sins into which we have slipped or were unwisely chosen.
- P: We would recall them now, if we could. Let us do as Jesus said, and repent and believe in the good news. Let us start with prayer.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

- P: Have mercy on Your church, O God, for we forget the covenant into which You call us. We muddle along in our self-serving schemes rather than waiting on Your word. We follow the path of least resistance without seeking Your higher way.
- C: We forget our baptism into a faith community built on trust and forgiveness. We turn from the vision of heaven to the treacherous hell of competing egos.
- P: O God, we turn to You to lead us to a new day.
- A: According to Your steadfast love, forgive us, and transform us with spiritual progress, we pray. In Jesus' name. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON Romans 5:18-19-21

P: "Therefore, just as one man's (Adam's) trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's (Jesus') act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous . . . as sin exercised dominion in death, so grace might also exercise dominion through justification leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

This is a long way of saying that in Jesus Christ our sins are forgiven and we are right with the Lord by God's grace. Such forgiveness opens the gates of heaven for us and all who call on the Name in truth. Truly God is good! It is not just for me to proclaim it but for us to accept it. 



MISSION MOMENTS February 18, 2024 First Sunday in Lent Psalm 25:1-10 God's Loving Paths

The psalmist asserts that God is with them all the way along the path. Sometimes, it is not so clear to see God's hand at work. To understand God's movement in your life, it can be helpful to create a spiritual timeline. Why wait? Use this paper to begin creation of your spiritual timeline right now.

When was the first time you remember sensing God's presence?

What names or images of God did you hold when you were younger that are different now?

List two or three times of illness, grief or despair when you experienced God with you.

List two or three times of gratitude or joy when you experienced God with you.

Looking back, was there a circumstance or common thread that is carried across all the memories you share here? Were you alone or with a group? Were you in a church building or in nature? Were you actively seeking God's presence, or did the Divine intrude unexpectedly into everyday life?

What does this exercise reveal about the presence of God in your life? Up to now? In this present moment? Into the future?

Genesis 9:8-17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, "As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth."

God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

1 Peter 3:18 - 22

¹⁸For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

<u>Mark 1:9 - 15</u>

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

¹²And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. ¹³He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

¹⁴Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, ¹⁵and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."
