- P: This is true for this church, its history, and for you and me. So, after taking time to read the prayer of confession silently to ourselves, let us confess aloud together ways we have fallen short.


PRAYER OF CONFESSION

A: On this Anniversary Sunday, prayers of confession can come hard, as life has been hard in a lot of ways. Yet we as individuals and as St. Peter's, even while doing what we think is all we can do, still admit to sins of omission. We could have stood up for unarmed victims of brutality and gun violence. We could have shared our faith more. We could have engaged with those working to non-violently heal the centuries-long effects of racism, and join those trying to bring truth to confront the circulating lies about Christianity. We could have been attentive and responsive to attacks upon persons in the LGBTQ + community. We could have prayed more for this country, our leaders, the least of these wherever they are, and for our church. Forgive us, and St. Peter's U.C.C. these, and any other ways we have grieved Your Holy Spirit! Create in us new hearts, after Yours; for it is in the name of Jesus Christ we humbly pray. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

P: "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all . . . while we wait for . . . the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds" (*Titus 2:11, 13-14*).

MISSION MOMENTS

May 7, 2023 Fifth Sunday of Easter John 14:1-14 Enduring Witness

A communion liturgy based on John 14, NRSV.

Leader: Jesus said, "Believe in God, believe also in me."

People: And the people said, "How can we know The Way?"

Leader: And Jesus said, "I am the Way. And the truth. And the light."

People: And the people said, "Show us, and we will be satisfied."

Leader: And Jesus said, "If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it. And so since you have asked, today I will show you one of the ways that I will always be here with you."

People: And so Jesus took the bread, and broke it, and gave it to them and said, "I am the Way and the truth and the life."

Leader: If you know me, you will know my Abba God also. And I will show you, so you remember. Take this bread. This bread is

just like my body, whenever you eat it and remember all that unites you, I am with you."

People: And after supper, Jesus took the cup and poured it out sharing it with them. And again he told them. "I am the Way and the truth and the life."

Leader: Then he said "In my Abba's house there are many rooms. And I will show you, so you remember. This is the cup of forgiveness, which is as vast as my Abba's house in heaven. This cup is grace, poured out abundantly on all and for all."

People: Then Jesus said, "I go and prepare a place for you, so that where I am, there you will be also."

Leader: This is Christ's table and all are welcome here. Come from the East and the West, from the North and the South to gather at this feast for forgiveness and unity.

SCRIPTURES FOR THE CONGREGATION

<u>Psalm 103</u>

Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless God's holy name. Bless the LORD, O my soul, and do not forget all God's benefits who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the Pit,

who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, who satisfies you with good as long as you live

so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's. The LORD works vindication and justice for all who are oppressed. He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel. The LORD is merciful and gracious,

slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

God will not always accuse, nor will God keep divine anger forever.

But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him, and his righteousness to children's children,

to those who keep God's covenant and remember to do the commandments. The LORD has established God's throne in the heavens,

and God's kingdom rules over all.

you mighty ones who do his bidding, obedient to his spoken word. Bless the LORD, all his hosts, his ministers that do his will. Bless the LORD, all God's works, in all places of God's dominion.

Matthew 6:1-8, 16-21

Jesus said, "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.

So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

"And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."
