SOFT GOODS DONATIONS AND SPECIAL COLLECTION DAYS! Now's a great time to clear out those closets, basements, storage lockers and garages and help us at the same time! We are collecting clothing, shoes, hats, belts, purses, linens, stuffed toys and bedding through the end of January. We get 20 cents/pound and our goal is 1,000 pounds. We will be at church for people to drop off donations *January 20 and 27 6:30-8:30 pm and January 23 and 30 11:00-1:00.* We also collect them on Mondays when the office is open. Anyone who has keys can bring donations anytime, they should leave them in the gym.

NEW LIVESTREAM ONLINE SERVICES! *Live Stream began January 3rd at 10am* — You will still be able to watch your worship service on Sunday mornings on YouTube ... they will still include a link to the bulletin in the description (also available on our website every week under the "Worship" tab), and they will still feature everything our worship service always includes — Prelude, Call to Worship, Readings, Special Music, Sermon, Prayers, and Postlude. However, the service will be broadcasted (aka streamed) LIVE AS IT HAPPENS from our Sanctuary on Sunday mornings. Important things to know about this are:

- We don't currently have people joining us in the sanctuary we have not "regathered" for worship yet. But when we DO, we will also continue to live stream in this exact way (and maybe even better, as we learn more about what we are doing).
- You will find the live stream exactly where you find the video now simply go to St Peter's YouTube channel, and it will start playing automatically when the service begins
- If you can't watch it right at 10am, the VIDEO of the service will be available later in the day in the same place.
- Broadcasting the live service will hopefully give the feel of being actually IN the church, which we are all eager to get back to.

ANNUAL MEETING - In the interest of safety, Council is choosing to be pro-active and has *decided* to hold our Annual Meeting on January 31st as a Zoom call. We realize and acknowledge that NOT EVERYONE can attend this type of meeting. We are giving ample notice about this to allow for alternative solutions to this challenge. Perhaps if you are not able to Zoom, you can (safely) join a friend or family member on that day that CAN Zoom, and participate in that way. Or communicate your thoughts or concerns to a Council member before-hand ... we will allow proxies at this meeting. Sadly, we haven't figured out how to feed everyone this way.   gift drive online. Toys, games, gift cards and more can be purchased at UCAN's Walmart gift
  registry. Donations are requested by Monday, December 7th.
- A Just Harvest Community Kitchen allows us to break bread with neighbors in need. Since
  the start of the pandemic, support from St. Peter's members has helped the Kitchen provide
  hundreds of meals to go. In 2021 we are supporting meals on January 30th, May 29th, July

- Niles Township Food Pantry continues to fulfill its motto of "serving food with dignity." Each
