INVOCATION

Ever-present God, on this Good Friday night, our whole world is engulfed in shadows as we remember the story of Jesus' death. We confess that we want to push the fast-forward button on this familiar story because it hurts so much. It hurts to think of the betraval and arrest of Jesus. It hurts to imagine Jesus abandoned and suffering on the cross with only a faithful few watching him breathe his last breath. It hurts to watch your light overtaken by the shadows of the world. But we must find our place in this crucifixion story and feel the pain that is there: The pain of the world, of faithless decisions; of betrayal; of injustice. 

Welcome and thank you for attending our Good Friday Vespers service of Scripture, music, candlelight, song, silence and prayer. There are offering plates in the Narthex and by the Schmidt Memorial window near the pulpit for any who wish to make an offering tonight.

Thank you to everyone who played a role in tonight's service, including our Deacon and live-streamer! We could not do it without you.

The bell tolls 33 times for each year (approximation) of Jesus' earthly life.

The candle brought in at the end represents Jesus' words to His disciples that the Son of Man would rise again on the 3rd day.

Following some Sanctuary and Easter Egg Hunt prep work tomorrow, we celebrate Christ's Resurrection in our Sunday 10 AM service! We will celebrate the Lord's Supper, sing some great hymns (with a little trumpet added), enjoy an Anthem, homily, and Scriptures. Then the young ones can take part in our Easter Egg Hunt prepared in our Gym (11:15) and then, for those who planned to stay for it, an Easter Brunch at 11:30 downstairs. There will not be any pews roped off, but we do ask that respect and some distance be given to those who for safety's sake come masked. The nursery will be attended, as it is every Sunday.
