*PRAYER OF CONFESSION

O God, we sing and praise You, happy of heart and strong of spirit, when we are among others who praise You, too. But in times of stress, we seek scapegoats to be targets of our anger. We betray those we love and who have loved us; and we turn against You, too busy to seek You, too selfish to obey You. Your compassion is without bounds, O God, for You forgive us again and again. You restore us to a right spirit and bring us to worship You again. God of steadfast love, teach us how to be steadfast too; through Jesus Christ we pray.

*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Paul both admonishes and inspires the Ephesian Christians, "Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us, and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God" (4:31-5:2).

God in Christ has forgiven you. As Jesus said elsewhere, let us go and do likewise.



ANNOUNCEMENTS

Good Morning! Welcome to worship as we join a worldwide and timeless procession of the faithful shouting to Jesus, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9, NIV).

The Lenten Bible Study is off this coming Wednesday. As usual, we take Holy Week off from the Study, but we'll finish up on April 7 at the usual time. A Zoom link will be sent to participants.

Holy Week at St Peter's: Our Church Council approved the Worship and Music Committee's proposal to hold a hybrid of in-person and online worship, out of respect for those who are unable to attend, and in joyous welcome for those who are ready to re-enter the sanctuary. Our hope is that worship will be fulfilling and nurturing to all who participate, either from home or in person.

Following COVID safety protocols for distance,

temperature-taking, sanitizing, cleaning, time inside and masking, we will be limiting attendance to fewer than 40 per service, and will take online reservations for those who plan to come in person. A link will be sent out via email NEXT MONDAY, March 29th at 9 AM that will allow folks to sign up for worship services they would like to attend in person. The schedule of services is as follows:

Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship will also be livestreamed at 7 PM. We are also inviting people to join us in person for these 2 services. There will be Communion provided in the same way it was for Christmas Eve and Ash Wednesday.

Easter Sunday worship will begin at 10 AM, and will be both livestreamed and include people in the sanctuary. Communion will be offered the same as before.

All 3 in-person options (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday) will be 40 minutes long with limited singing, and will have a maximum of 40 people in the sanctuary (this includes Pastor, Ben, Jen, and the Lector).

Next week's Resurrection Sunday Lector is Jessica Schneider.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN LENT PALM SUNDAY

March 28, 2021

Mark 14:1-15:47

Into Jerusalem

Imagine you were there that day.

Today, the day is known as Palm Sunday and we celebrate mostly sedately, with children waving palm leaves and songs of joy.

But it would not have been so that first day. On that first day of the first holy week, it was dusty and noisy, crowded and chaotic. On that day, Jesus riding the donkey into Jerusalem was just one more distraction and delight, a spectacle for a city in a festival mood. On that day, no one but Jesus could imagine the week that was to come, with its loyalties and betrayals, politics and pieties, losses and griefs. No one could have anticipated that the week would end in death and in resurrection.

What would it be like to enter the city again, as they did that first day so long ago? What would it be like to come to this day with no knowledge, no expectation of how this week would end? Each year, we are invited to re-enact the events of this week. Not as a tired recitation of a story whose ending is already known, but as living and breathing people, ready to experience each day anew.

Many faith communities will worship together several times this week. Even if your community does not gather for all these days, how can you mark each day this week?

SCRIPTURES FOR THE PALM SUNDAY CONGREGATION 3 / 28 / 2021

Psalm 118:1-2, 19-29

"O give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good;

His steadfast love endures forever!

Let Israel say, 'His steadfast love endures forever.'

Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them,

And give thanks to the Lord.

This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall enter through it.

I thank You that You have answered me

And have become my salvation.

The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.

This is the Lord's doing;

It is marvelous in our eyes.

This is the day that the Lord has made;

Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Save us, we beseech You, O Lord,

O Lord, we beseech You, give us success!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

We bless you from the house of the Lord.

The Lord is God, and he has given us light.

Bind the festal procession with branches,

Up to the horns of the altar!

You are my God, and I will give thanks to You;

You are my God, I will extol You.

O give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good,

For His steadfast love endures forever."

Philippians 2:5 - 11

Paul wrote, Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

John 12:12-16

The next day the great crowd that had come to the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord—the King of Israel!" Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it; as it is written:

"Do not be afraid, daughter of Zion.

Look, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written of him and had been done to him.
