

#### FOURTH SUNDAY CONVERSATIONS; OUR OWN WORLD CAFE



Calling all members and friends of St. Peter's! Your Church Council has launched a series of Fourth Sunday Conversations, gatherings for members and friends at special coffee hours on the fourth Sunday of each month. By the time you read this, we will have had our first Fourth Sunday Conversation on April 28th! If you missed it or want to come back for more conversation, mark your calendars and join us on Sunday, May 26th and Sunday, June 23rd.

We will spend a little—but not too much—time in intentional conversation. We are having these coffee chats after worship so that it's easy for you to drop in, enjoy a bit of conversation, and then get on with your early summer days. What are Fourth Sunday Conversations, you ask? First,

let's start with what Fourth Sunday Conversations are not. Fourth Sunday Conversations are NOT about planning next steps after Pastor's departure, but they are about matters of the heart and how we thrive as a community today, tomorrow, and for years to come. Fourth Sunday Conversations are NOT strategic planning sessions, although you may find yourself engaging in conversation about hopes and dreams for our church. Fourth Sunday Conversations are NOT a platform for expressing opinions, rather Fourth Sunday Conversations are a time for authentic sharing. We want to listen together and learn from the experiences, knowledge, and feelings of everyone—and we mean everyone.

Fourth Sunday Conversations are NOT your standard coffee hour, but you should anticipate relaxed conversation about matters of mind and heart, and you will experience joy in fellowship. #### FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK

As I draw nearer to the time of my retirement, I thought that some mutually agreed-upon "rules for engagement" between myself and Beth, and the church and its members/friends, ought to be communicated. I thought this would be a good place, and good timing. However, more intentional work needs to be done between the Council and the Lanfords, so there is nothing specific to report at that time, except the general rule that under almost all circumstances, there isn't to be any contact between us and the members of Saint Peter's for a considerable amount of time. This allows the new pastor to get called and begin settling in, planting his/her/their own roots of relationship with you, and allows me to be really retired. More about that in the next Announcer, however!

I thought that with that not ready at all, I'd do a walk down Memory Lane in the 1990's block. When Beth and I came in the summer of 1992, the church did not have any computers, although when I was installed in February of the next year, the church gave me a PS/1 or 2 as the installation gift, so the ice was broken! Getting on the Internet came a few years later. Before I had even started, I remember Ed Biegert and I helping to unload the truck which had the long, red pew cushions. We helped lug them up the Oakton Street steps, and we still use those to this day. One of the first things I did besides that was to ask for some \$\$ to buy directional signs to put near our entrances, and around the church. Our

directional signs to put near our entrances, and around the church. Our building is not easy for visitors to find their way around. The Ketters put up the money and Ed Paige mounted the changeable letter signs that went on walls. We still have those today, including the ones on moveable stands. Got to be inviting!

I asked for a long-range planning session, which took place in the middle of March 1993. It snowed pretty good, dampening the attendance. All the same, one of the things that arose from that planning session was the creation of the Church Growth and Evangelism Committee. For some years that Committee did good, if unheralded, work. Some of the things we did were the creation of the Supplemental Songbooks (which underwent a few incarnations), the Kids Activity Bags which hang outside the narthex, and advertising in the newspaper on a regular basis. The Committee itself had many members come and go over the years.

Our mission activity through the then-Good News Community Kitchen began before we got here, but it blossomed in the 1990s under Rich Miller at the helm. Later in the 2000s he handed it over to others, including Beth, but it was a big part of our mission work then as now.

The Softball team was created in time for the inaugural season of 1994. Among the players for us were Beth and John Sterba, Paul and Beth Brzozowski, Alane Schaller, Elaine Goldberg, Bob Kuehn, Mark and Brenda Karol, Henry Muhrer, scorekeeper Eric Svenson, and others. In the 1990s we had a Tuesday bag-lunch and Bible Study, which was attended by retirees.

I continued Pastor Tom's tradition of midweek Lenten day services on Wednesdays.

The Youth Fellowship was ready-made and waiting. With help from Carol lannotti and several others, the group and its adults put on a Halloween Party for neighborhood kids, and a Haunted House which developed a scary reputation over the years. When some kids like Eric Svenson aged out of the Youth Fellowship they continued to oversee, and ran, the Spook House. Then there were a few Youth Fellowship lock-ins. I think we stopped at two; my temperament was not made for those.

One of the great climaxes of the decade was in Advent 1998, when we received 12 new members into St. Peter's – the most ever at one time under my pastorate. Maybe even cooler was that I baptized 3 adults joining that day: Chuck LeCroy, Heather and Katy Schuhrke.

I know this is long; good thing I chose to stick to the '90s! May all our memories be blessings.
